*Calculation of Indices: A number of measures can be derived, for example, the **perceived** extent of risk associated with legal vs. illegal substances and the extent to which frequency of use is a determinant of risk.. This latter measure can be obtained by comparing the 'occasional' with the 'regular' use of each substance.*
